

## QUESTIONS:

**Start by reading chapter 27 together.**

1. What is the main idea of this passage?
2. What stands out to you from this passage and/or the sermon from Sunday?
3. In Isaiah 27:1, God defeats Leviathan, a symbol of chaos. How do you see chaos and disorder affecting the world today?
4. In verses 2-5, God compares His people to a garden or vineyard that He lovingly cares for. How do you see God tending to and caring for your life in this season?
5. In the text, God offers peace even to those who are like “briars and thorns.” How can we extend that peace to those who might feel like outsiders?
  - a. How can we work together at this as a group?
  - b. How do you think lost people think about our evangelism efforts towards them?
  - c. Is there someone you know who is “lost” or distant from God, and how can we pray for or support you in reaching out to them?
6. What do you think it means to have “no discernment” as described in verse 11, and how does that relate to rejecting God?
  - a. How can we grow in discernment, both individually and as a group?
7. One of the key themes from the sermon was rest in God. What are some burdens or anxieties you need to lay down in order to experience God’s peace and rest?
8. Discipleship is more than just sharing the Gospel; it’s also about walking with others as they grow in their faith. Are you interested in being in a DGroup? What keeps you from being in one?
