1. What is the main idea of this passage?
2. What stands out to you from this passage and/or the sermon from Sunday?
3. What are some things we learn about God's character in Isaiah 36-37?
4. In what ways did the Rabshakeh try to create doubt among God's people?
 - a. What do you think is the greatest cause of doubt in Christians today?
5. What are some strategies Hezekiah used to deal with doubt?
 - a. How have you had the most success dealing with doubt?
 - b. Why is prayer so powerful for increasing our faith?
6. Hezekiah asks Isaiah to pray on behalf of the people. How can we build stronger prayer relationships?
 - a. Why is staying connected to godly community crucial during trials?
 - b. Would you be interested in being a part of a prayer serve team?
7. What does Isaiah 37:21 teach us about prayer?
 - a. Do you have a strategy for intentional times of prayer (i.e. praying through scripture, using the petitions of the model prayer, using notecards for prayer requests)? What is it?
 - b. What are the benefits of having some type of prayer strategy?
8. What is the zeal of the Lord? Why should we worship him because of his zeal?
9. Do you think most of the American church sees themselves more as being under siege by an enemy or more being sent out as ambassadors for God's kingdom?
 - a. Does this matter?
